MEETING NOTES SUMMARY

December 4, 2014 5:00 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. @PAHWF

Meeting notes:

- 1. Justin K. updated the committee on the tasks he assisted with since the last committee meeting:
 - a. Kenilworth Park design concepts: Preparation of concepts for planting and stormwater management and presentation to the North Coventry P&R Commission. The township will pursue a grant to address stormwater drainage issues. Justin K. will look for a matching grant to install the plantings.
 - b. Douglass parks master plans: Preparation of a power point presentation showing existing conditions, and lead the presentation at the first public meeting.
 - c. Upper and Lower Pottsgrove connections to Bike and Walk Pottstown: windshield survey of existing conditions and preparation of a map showing several potential alignment alternatives.
 - d. Other meetings: DCNR grant workshop; DCNR circuit rider orientation; presentation with SRGA at the DCNR annual meeting to promote the region; present existing conditions for Gerald Richards Park at Lower Pottsgrove Parks & Recreation Board meeting; Gerald Richards Park scoping field view visits with engineer consultants; Pottstown Crossfit; Mosaic Community Gardens; Pottstown Area Council of Governments; Hanover Meadows Site Visit (North Coventry); and, Colebrookdale Rail Road.
- 2. Jay E. mentioned that Laura Washington of Mosaic Land Trust has offered to assist the township to establish a community garden at the Coventry Woods Preserve for use by the YWCA day camp. Ashley P. mentioned that Laura Washington is funded to assist municipalities with developing community gardens.

- 3. Next, Ashley P. provided an update on the status of the Foundation's grants. She noted that the PAHWF Mini grants were awarded and will provide \$200,000 to the region over the next 4 years. She also stated that letters of intent for PAHWF grants are due on February 1, 2015. A grant information session will be held on January 14th, 2015. Responding to questions from members in attendance, she stated the projects such as pedestrian bridges and community gardens would be considered.
- 4. Justin K. asked the committee for their input on the potential for the regional recreation coordinator to provide playground inspection services. Jay E. stated that it would be helpful to have someone provide certified inspections of playgrounds for liability purposes. Justin K. responded that he will discuss this with Michael Lenhart since he is a certified playground inspector. Meredith T. inquired about the possibility for playground inspection training to be covered as a part of the circuit rider grant. This topic will be put on an upcoming meeting agenda for further discussion.
- 5. Justin K. mentioned that less of his time has been spent on projects for West Pottsgrove Township compared to other municipalities, and he would like dedicate more time to this township in the upcoming months. Charlie V. mentioned that the township needs help generating interest and administrating their public pool. Justin K. agreed to spend time in the next few weeks to research examples of successful community pools and assist with marketing efforts. Ideas to increase memberships could include marketing the pool to other townships in the region and partnering with local businesses, institutions and events to offer membership promotions. Montgomery County Community College and the Pottstown Rumble were mentioned as potential partners.
- 6. Justin K. provided a summary of the grant funding matrices which are appended to these notes. Meredith T. suggested that Douglas Township, Montgomery County be added to priority R.2-West and Manatawny Trail Connections. Justin K. asked that municipalities review the list to determine which grants they might be interested in pursuing in spring, 2015. In the next two weeks, Justin K. will be reaching out to schedule meetings with each municipality to discuss their grant priorities.
- 7. Meredith T. will send Justin K. contacts for New Hanover and East Coventry so he can invite them to the January Recreation Committee meeting.
- 8. The meeting concluded with updates from the PARRC partners:
 - a. <u>PAHWF:</u> Ashley P. stated that PAHWF has allocated \$9,000 to be provided as a match for pledges made during the next Parks Promotion Contest. A discussion on the details of the contest will be on the agenda for the next recreation committee meeting.
 - b. <u>Montgomery County:</u> Meredith T. mentioned that DVRPC is obligated to give the region \$60,000 per year for transportation planning. Ideas for projects should be forwarded to her in the next couple weeks. This is open to all forms of transportation including pedestrian and bicycle.
 - c. <u>North Coventry Township:</u> Jay E. stated that the township has made progress in streamlining their athletic field reservation forms. Roof repairs are underway at the Fernbrook Lodge and have been completed at the Riverbend Park pavilion. The township would like to begin the planning and design of a sensory trail this winter.

- d. <u>Douglass Township:</u> Pete H. stated that the public meeting for Douglass, Smith and Libor parks was very well done and well received. Once that project finishes, master planning will commence for Keller, Rhoads and Moyer parks. It was stated that Douglass Township partners with community pools in Boyertown and New Hanover.
- 9. After the meeting, the following votes for the tagline were tallied: Option 1 (1 vote), option 2 (6 votes), option 3 (1 vote), option 4 (0 votes). The design for the business card was approved by a unanimous vote.
